

ORDINANCE NO. 747

An Ordinance Prohibiting the Parking of Trucks or Trailers, With or Without Tractor or Towing Vehicle Attached Thereto, On Any Street Within the City of Blytheville, Arkansas, and Prohibiting Obstruction of Sidewalks; Providing a Penalty for the Violation Thereof; Declaring an Emergency; and For Other Purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLYTHEVILLE, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful to park any truck of over one-half ton rated capacity, house or cargo type trailer, with or without the tractor or towing vehicle attached thereto, on any street in the City of Blytheville, Arkansas, except as set out in Section 3 herein.

SECTION 2. It shall also be unlawful to park any kind of vehicle on any of the sidewalks of the City or otherwise to obstruct said sidewalks unnecessarily.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful to park any truck or trailer of over one-half ton rated capacity upon any street of the City of Blytheville, Arkansas, for a period of time longer than one hour at any time, day or night, unless the owner or one responsible for its use is actively engaged in loading or unloading.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm, corporation, or association violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00.

SECTION 5. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict here-with are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Parking of vehicles and trailers in the manner hereinabove prohibited frequently contributes to the cause of accidents, hinders the free flow of traffic on streets and prohibits the use of sidewalks by pedestrians, and unless provisions of this Ordinance are put into effect immediately, the

peace, health, and safety of the citizens of Blytheville, Arkansas, will be adversely affected. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
